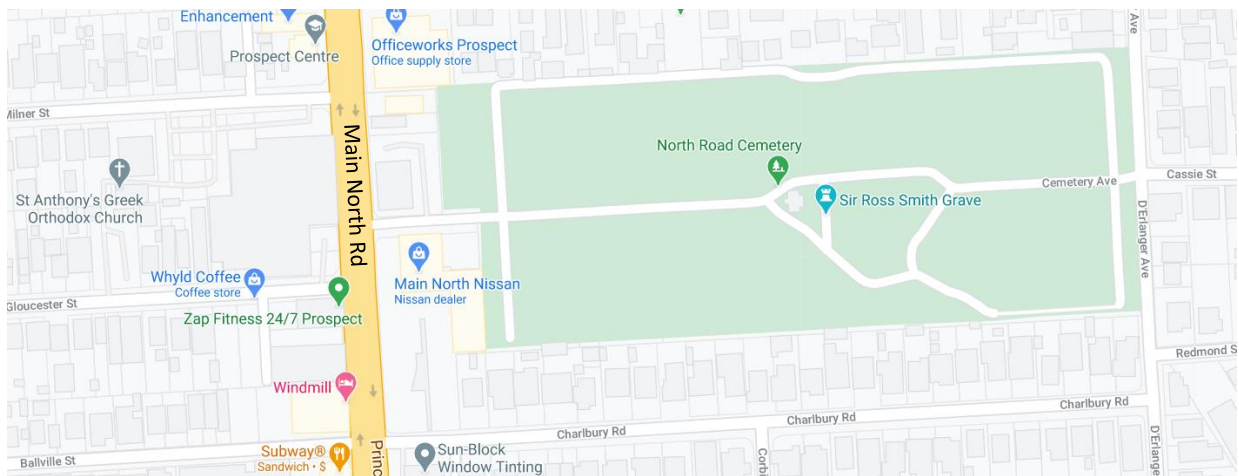
Our club and **Prospect** will jointly run the BBQ and the DV Kit display.
