Notes from Meeting 2034 – 2nd of February

Apologies were received from John G and Ashleigh. Les confirmed who will be serving at the next Bunnings Sausage Sizzle which is being held next Saturday the 13th of February.

Russell also obtained names for who would be doing what at the membership event being held at Bowden on the 26th of February. Jack & Jack advised they will be meeting with Port District Football Club to explore opportunities to sponsor sporting equipment for a girl's team.

Club Forum

The Club Forum, led by **Les** and **Vic**, covered a wide range of topics as follows:

YOUTH - Ron explained that the club supports **RYPEN**, **RYLA** and **NYSF** with the club committing to one candidate for each program each year (funds permitting). He is intending to have a dedicated Youth Forum Club Meeting in May. The meanings of these acronyms are as follows:

RYPEN: - Rotary Youth Program of **EN**richment provides a group of young people aged 14 to 17, an opportunity to develop valuable leadership skills by way of a weekend long program which involves engaging with like-minded people while having fun and learning new skills in areas such as problem solving and public speaking.

RYLA: - Rotary Youth Leadership Awards is a 7 day residential leadership seminar. It is aimed at young adults aged 18 to 25, keen to exercise their leadership potential and to participate in a range of formal and informal activities, which promote leadership skills as desirable qualities.

NYSF: - National Youth Science Forum is a program to inspire young Australians to value science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) and its importance in our communities. It achieves this by delivering immersive and transformative youth-led experiences to young Australians to encourage life-long STEM literacy. Rotary is the Founding Partner of the NYSF and, currently, its major funding partner is Lockheed Martin Australia.

MEMBERSHIP PROMOTION – **Russell** presented the reduced annual fee scheme being offered to people up to 35 years of age who have insufficient funds to afford the full membership.

CLUB SHIRTS – **Russell** outlined a “vibrant club polo shirt” and is convening a small committee for this.

COMMUNITY - Jack P outlined the urgent Australia wide Rotary effort to eradicate Trachoma in Australia. He will learn more about it from other clubs actively participating in this programme.

HOT DAY POLICY – **Les** suggested that, while it has been discussed previously, a hot day policy should exist for events such as Bunnings Sausage Sizzle. It was generally considered that such events should be cancelled if the weather is forecast to reach 38^o or more.

INTERNATIONAL – **Brian** introduced the International Nepal Fellowship Leprosy Project and suggested the club support this where it can.

He also mentioned the **Centurion Membership** of the Rotary Foundation and reminded us that the contribution should be made online.

COMMUNITY/YOUTH - Brian also raised the possibility of the club providing **Classroom Hearing Devices** to Largs Bay School to add to those provided in the past. **Jack K** is following up.

FIRST AID – **Brian** has updated the Corolla Capers kit and we need to ensure it is done annually. The club should consider the provision of a **Defibrillator** to CC and catering events.

BOARD GOVERNANCE – All Directors are encouraged to place ‘Motions’ after the relevant ‘arguments’ have been sent to the Board in advance of the Board Meeting.

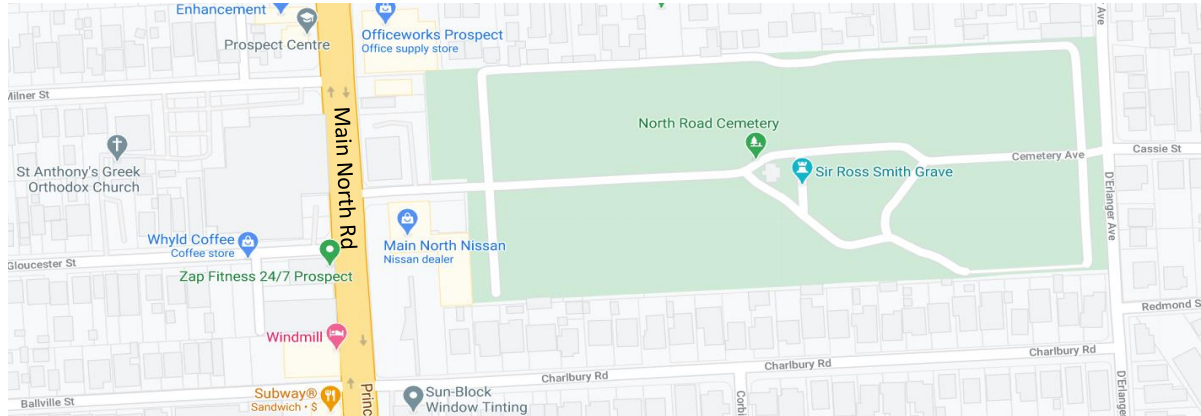

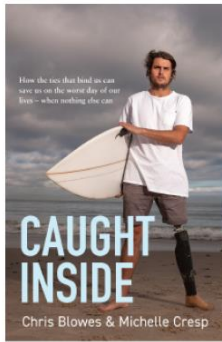
North Road Cemetery Vocational Visit – 9th of February

On Anzac Day, 2015, **Chris Blowes** was paddling in after an average morning of surf when he was attacked twice by a great white shark.

He had lost a leg and if that wasn't bad enough, he was bleeding out and at the bottom of a cliff.

If he made it to the top, it was still another 35 kilometres to the nearest country hospital at Port Lincoln.

Then it was a further 600 kilometres to the nearest trauma centre in Adelaide. The odds were definitely stacked in the shark's favour.

Chris will share his story of survival and what it took to just get on with life!

How to overcome the challenges life throws at you and how to proudly reflect on your trauma and your post trauma growth.

Life is fragile. Chris will inspire you to make the most of the cards you have been dealt. Otherwise what's the point!

Chris is now working as a carpenter in Adelaide and is back surfing.
