The event, due to COVID restrictions, had to stay within South Australia. Silverton was scratched but it was another successful event with participants in vehicles. We had, leaving Kartmania, 11 Corollas and 9 support and 4WD vehicles. A total of 37 participants from **Saturday 26th June - Saturday 3rd July 2021.**

DAILY JOURNAL & ODYSSEY NOTES.

- **DAY ONE.** After a send-off by President Vic, at Kartmania, the convoy headed up Grand Junction Rd for the first time heading to Mannum and then onto the Mallee and Ngarkat Conservation Park. The Jamie Wells Track to Box Flat presented the first event challenge with many of the corollas being pulled over the mallee dunes with the fast approaching sunset. Night One around a very comfortable campfire thanks to Tintinara Lions Club donation of a trailer of firewood. President Angela introduced the Bookie's Bag Draw. The first of 8 days of Caper adventure and collegiality.
- **DAY TWO.** Heading via Lameroo to the SA VIC Border track. Heavy support vehicles found the track too narrow so headed directly to Renmark after lunch.
