

Notes from Meeting #2061 – 17th of August

We had **apologies** from Ernie, John O and Brian. **Dale** started proceedings by telling us more **club history** and how, in 1980, Ernie advised that everyone had to have a role in the club.

This week was very special as we had the **District Governor, Jeff Neal**, and his wife **Jenny**, attending. In accordance with previous practice our Board Members had a pre-meeting with Jeff to go through our programs and plans for this current Rotary Year.

Jeff gave us a presentation outlining his thoughts on what is important to him as **Governor of District 9510** which has 84 Clubs and is divided into 12 Areas (Jeff Cluse is our Area Governor – Area 12) and is in Zone 8. He showed us a short film by the Rotary International President, **Shekhar Mehta** who urges *members to become more involved in service projects, saying that caring for, and serving others, is the best way to live because it changes not only other people's lives, but also our own.* Jeff discussed the push by the President to increase membership encouraging each member to persuade someone to join Rotary, which would effectively double our membership. Jeff cautioned that he believes it is better to take action on real projects in order to grow by example, rather than pursue membership growth for its own sake. In other words he stressed that ***we should do more grow more.***



Jenny gave us a presentation on **allkids**, a not-for-profit organization providing education to disadvantaged children in rural Cambodia. Currently it is supporting over 450 children and educates them to Grade 12 giving them great opportunities within their community. Anyone can sign up online and support a child for \$30 a month.

Jeff closed off by encouraging us all to have a story about Rotary readily available in case a situation arises when we can tell it. **Angela** thanked Jeff & Jenny as shown here.
