Tanya has skills in developing computer-generated promotional material which she is prepared to assist the club with. Jeff demonstrated a couple of comparisons in the type of material that might be used in future letter-drops various areas.

ONE and ALL

Ron Rogers reported that he and President Angela had welcomed our most recent 'One and All' voyager back and reemphasised the value of this project.

CAROUSEL APPRECIATION

Jack Kelso reported via email that he had been made aware of a 'thankyou' sent regarding a recent adult birthday event held at the Carousel and that one of the children was asking that their future party be held there. A worthwhile community service as well as being a healthy fundraiser for the club.

Thank you to all who help on the roster.

Mark Streich introduced Guest Speaker Johannes Scheiber (Manager/Homeless Services) and Anna Dodd (Partnerships and fundraising coordinator) from HYP A (Helping Young People Achieve)

Johannes gave a comprehensive presentation regarding the work of HYP A, its connection to the Service to Youth Council and their new facility, 'THE FOUNDRY', at 46 Carrington Street.

He highlighted the problem with stereotypes regarding images of homelessness (he prefers ROOFlessness), especially when transferred from the adult to youth populations. Only 6% of all people and all ages who are homeless, actually sleep on the streets. Homelessness has increased by 13.7% over past 4 years and the fastest growing cohort is women over 45!

2/5 of homeless are under 25. Around 20% of First Nations people experience homelessness while they constitute 3% of the population.

Youth often 'Couch -Surf' or 'Sex-Surf' and just keep on the move. Causes mostly relate to the multifactorial broken relationships in homes complicated by lack of employment opportunities, disparity between social support amounts and cost of living, unrecognised or under treated mental health issues, substance, use and abuse.

Johannes also touched on the adverse influence of such stressors on the developing brain with long term consequences as well as the more recognised physical health consequences.

The Foundry is providing more than just a refuge but also opportunity to try and help redirect lives.

While 'dollars' are appreciated other supports such as the emergency pack that Rotary have supplied are very important. It may well be that vocational guidance could be provided and the thought that suitable candidates for RYLA, RYPEN and The One and All may be found was discussed.

HYPAs works closely with all the other social support agencies such as Westcare, Salvation Army and Anglicare.

An immediate need for socks was mentioned and those present decided to launch a 'Sox Appeal' over the coming month

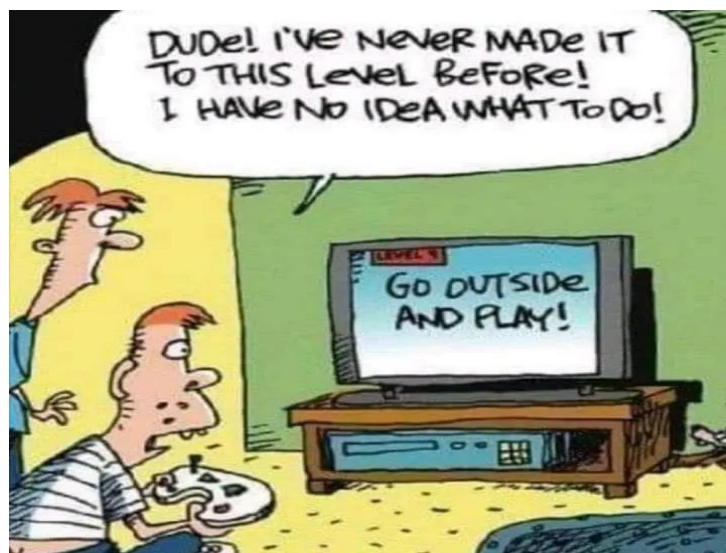
