After a storm had passed, we moved out to the outside open fire. **Sunday,** after another tasty breakfast of eggs and bacon, we cleaned up and headed for home.

Our first drinking water supply arrives at Green Pastures Hospital in Nepal

Brian has received this message and photos from Green Pastures Hospital.

We are thankful to Rotary Regency Park for supporting us to install a pure drinking water supply in the hospital premise for its patients and staff members. The water supply has been installed in the Out-Patient Department Waiting Area.

The water supply is conveniently located, readily visible and is accessible to wheelchair users. It is made up of stainless steel and has three water taps and is easy to clean and maintain. There is a dedicated support staff to take care of the water supply's daily maintenance and availability of paper cups. It is labelled with "Pure Drinking Water" and "Do not wash your hands" in local languages.

The patients and staff are very happy to have safe drinking water within easy access.
