Notes from Meeting #2115 – 27th of September

This week we had apologies from **Ernie John O & Jack K** and were very pleased to be joined by **Steve Sutton** and **Gary & Jane** of the Prospect Rotary Club. Steve is a member of the Darwin Rotary Club and has recently moved to Adelaide. He is an expert in disaster resilience and is currently running for Council in Charles Sturt.

Les reported on several events that are coming up. **Jeff** advised that Calperum are developing plans for working bees after the summer and more details will be available soon. **Brian** informed everyone about the short article on our club that he had prepared to be included in a forthcoming **International Nepal Foundation (INF)** publication.

Guest Speaker – Nicholas Egan – Preferential Voting

Nick gave a very interesting presentation on Australia's rather unique preferential voting system. He explained how it works for both the relatively simple single candidate election such as for a member of the House of Representatives and also for the more complex multi-seat election used for the Senate where 6 members are elected for each State. He used this to show how a person who won a clear majority of first preferences (i.e. received the number 1 vote on the ballot paper) could lose the seat and referred to a few examples from the recent Federal Election.



Nick clearly has a keen interest in the history of Australian Politics and gave some facts on our historical voting systems. The first vote held in Australia was in Adelaide in 1840, secret ballots being started in 1856 by William Boothby and preferential voting in 1890 by Catherine Helen Spence. Catherine was a minister of religion, a suffragist and supported preferential voting as being the fairest and most honest voting system that takes voters real intentions into account. He was thanked by Angela as shown here.

Our BBQ Trailer in use last week

Our BBQ trailer was in use last Monday for the opening of the Charities Uniting SA and AMES Australia Centre which will provide up to 39 refugees a room for six weeks, as a facility to help new migrants get on their feet. 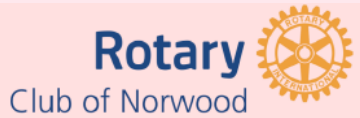

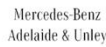
