Notes from Meeting #2125 – 6th of December

Brian reports that this week we had apologies from **Jack K, Jack P, Ernie, Russell & John O** and were delighted to be joined by guests: **Sue Berry, Liam Norman** (RYPEN attendee), **Emma Lill** ('One and All' attendee & resident of The Foyer), **Matt Closter** (Team Leader from 'The Foyer') & **Ryan Knowles** (Friend and 'Second Chances' mentoree of Les Dennis).

Mark S and President **Angela** chaired the meeting and introduced the guests. **Sue Berry** was present as, through her generosity of donating funds raised by the sale of tools and workshop equipment following the death of her husband, **Trevor**, she'd been very happy for the club to support young people attending Rotary youth projects. It was particularly special that Sue had attended Woodville High which is where Liam has just completed his Year 10.

Mark S gave an overview of the **RYPEN** project followed by **Liam** who spoke positively of the overall experience of his attendance. He particularly appreciated the opportunity to learn skills in handling difficult challenges and leadership, especially as his ambition is to be a police officer.

Emma spoke enthusiastically about her voyage on the 'One and All' and that the 'Rotary Youth Sailing Challenge' title lived up to expectations. Her tendency to motion sickness and recent onset of Rheumatoid Arthritis had presented special challenges for her but she managed them admirably and surprised herself. She made some constructive suggestions including the possibility of some 'same gender' voyages. Emma has just completed year 12 at the University of Adelaide Secondary College and plans to study Social Work.

Sue Berry presented a summary of **Trevor's** life highlighting the fact that he had demonstrated that any adversity may be able to be overcome with the right attitude, perseverance and opportunity. Born in 1945, he had been 'educated' when Dyslexia was not appreciated and so his inability to read and write well was interpreted and due to laziness and low intellect. Leaving school at 14, he worked in a factory where a boss recognised his manual skills and encouraged him to become an apprentice boilermaker. Sue spoke of how progressively Trevor's skills in design, creativity and positive interaction with people culminated in achieving a Fine Arts Degree with Distinction at the National Art School, Sydney. His enthusiasm in assisting fellow students was of special note. The legacy of his negative experiences relating to his dyslexia never entirely left him and Sue was forceful in her encouragement of Emma and Liam to face life's challenges with positivity.

The meeting again affirmed the value of the club's support for Rotary Youth programmes.

Angela concluded the meeting by reporting that she and **Jeff** had delivered 85 Christmas Hampers to Western Adelaide Domestic Violence Services with funds provided through the **Corolla Capers 2022 allocation**.

Expressions of Interest are being sought by 20 December from any Rotary member in District 9510 who may be interested. Please register with **District International Service Chair, Tim Mee**

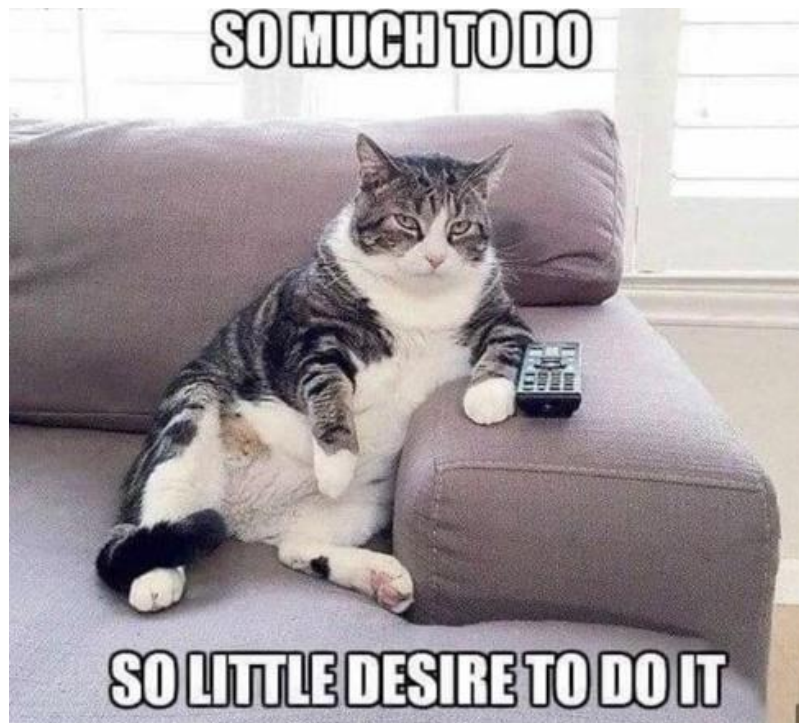
