**Les** passed around the rosters for our upcoming events.

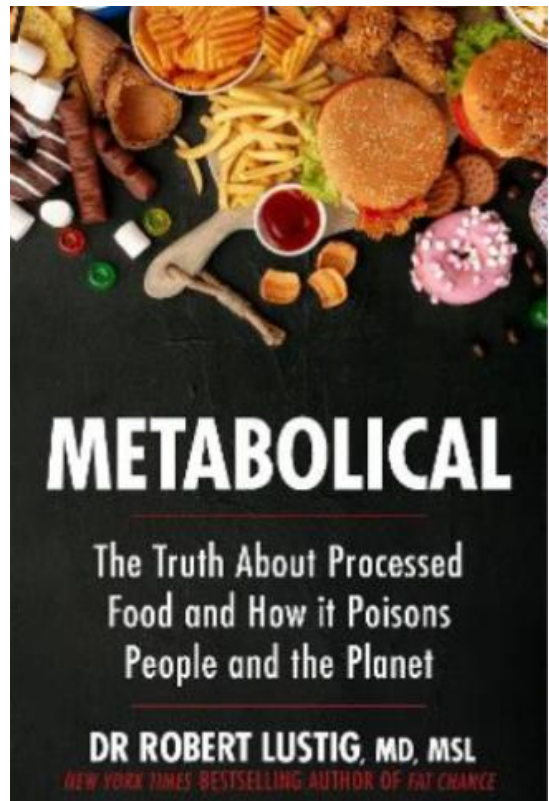
### Guest Speaker - Steve Brown (assisted by Ava) – “Koalas Deserve Better”



Steve gave an impassioned presentation starting with the plight of koalas (especially in the eastern states) but expanding it into an overall commentary on various extinction type events or catastrophic *tipping points*. He explained how he had spent about 10 years each at a veterinary school, researching koala diseases (gaining his PhD), working with the Samoan Government Department of Environment and Conservation and operating an Ecotourism Company in the Samoan Islands. He is currently working at raising funds to support the initial animation concept to put before a Hollywood company aimed at making a film to highlight the plight of koalas (see [www.lupeskin.com/koala-project](http://www.lupeskin.com/koala-project)).



Steve then broadened the presentation to raise various issues about mass extinctions, climate, processed foods and how we can improve our lives by eating better and avoiding processed foods. He strongly recommends that we all read this book “Metabological” by Robert Lustwig.

After Steve answered various questions Angela thanked Ava and Steve and presented them with our club pens.

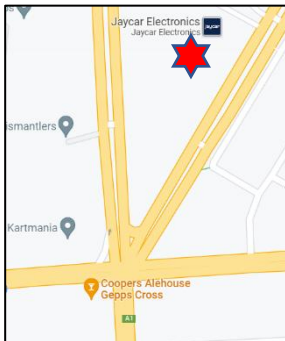




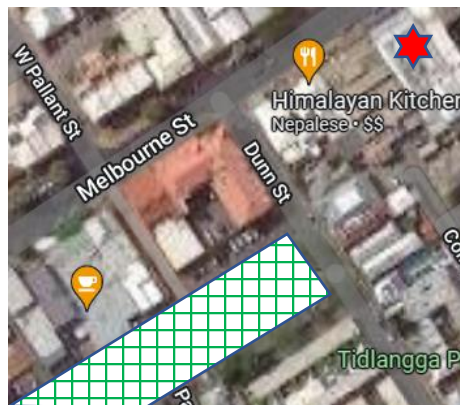
