

Guest Speaker – Kristen Newlyn – RFDS

Kristen gave us an enthusiastic and interesting presentation on the Royal Flying Doctor Service. She is a professional event organiser and is a Community Fundraising Specialist at the RFDS Central operations located next to Adelaide Airport. She went through the 95 year history of the RFDS and the special systems they setup such as the pedal radio, the

Numbered Medicine Chest and the body part numbering system that is partially featured on the older \$20 note which celebrates their founder, John Flynn (extract shown here). Kristen explained that the RFDS has the third largest aircraft fleet in

Australia and is a national, charitable, health organisation which delivers primary healthcare and 24-hour emergency services for those that live in rural and remote Australia. It has long been known as one of the largest aeromedical organisations in the world. Last year it made over 9,000 patient airlifts.

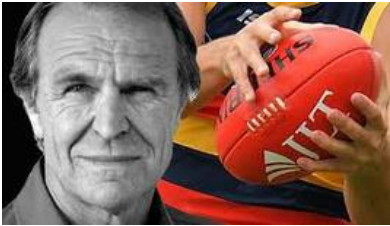
