Notes from Meeting #2152 – 11th of July.

This week our club meeting with President Vic Isbester in charge.

New process – Guess Speaker first then the meal to be served at 7.00pm followed by club business.

Guest Speaker Spot.

Re below – When noting the word Aborigine is noted, this includes Torres Strait Islander as well.

Our guest speaker was Harper Robb, unfortunately her offsider Will Taylor has COVID.

Harper has presented this presentation recently to Rotary Club of Adelaide Light and Rotaract Club of Adelaide City at a joint meeting.

Harper and Will are final year Law Students at the University of Adelaide and is presenting this information after discussions with Constitutional Lawyers.

In 2015, 40 Aboriginal Leaders asked for a better consultation with Aboriginal communities.

As a response, Referential Council was set up.

The council sent people out to different Aboriginal areas and asked, "what type of constitutional reform you would like to see to improve outcome for Aboriginal people".

Several options for constitutional reform were put forward, one was a "Voice to Parliament" but they moved away from the word "to Parliament".

The final agreement was for a body of First Nation representatives that could make representative to Parliament Executives to implement laws that affect them at the point of origin.

Question 1/ Jack Kelso – Are you saying the system is not working for the Aboriginal people, that's the reason we need to change?

Answer, yes, the Aboriginal people believe the system is not working.

Question 2/ Jack Pappin – If the Aboriginal people make a comment and the Government ignore it, what would be done.

Answer, The Voice will have very little power and if the Government ignore then the Aboriginals can approach the public for support to get the Government to rethink.

Question 3/ Vic Isbester – Will Aboriginals be seeking reimbursement for land lost.

Answer, I doubt it, but some detail may change with the Treaty to be considered.

Many other questions were raised – 15 were raised.

It was an extremely interesting night.

Items from Harpers slide show.

Key aspirations

1.Voice

A Voice would be a body of First Nations people who may make representations to the Federal Parliament and the Executive Government. It could influence the laws that affect Aboriginal people at the point of origin.

The statement asks that the Voice be enshrined in the Constitution. The dialogues articulated that they no longer wanted to be at the whim of governments who continuously undo reforms.

2. Treaty

This is complicated and there are many legal scholars and Aboriginal activists discussing how a treaty would function.

3. Truth

The establishment of a MakarrataCommission to oversee agreement-making and truth-telling between the government and Indigenous Australians.

The Question

"A Proposed Law: to alter the Constitution to recognise the First Peoples of Australia by establishing an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice. Do you approve this proposed alteration?"

"Chapter IX Recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples

129 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice In recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the First Peoples of Australia:

- 1. There shall be a body, to be called the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice:
- 2. The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice may make representations to the Parliament and the Executive Government of the Commonwealth on matters relating to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples;
- The Parliament shall, subject to this Constitution, have power to make laws with respect to matters relating to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice, including its composition, functions, powers and procedures."

Per The Solicitor General, The Voice "would not pose any threat" to ou system of government. In fact, it would "enhance" our system.

This is because:

1. The Voice does not alter the powers of parliament or government in any way.

Section 129(2) makes clear the Voice has no veto.

Section 129(2) also does not impose any obligation on parliament of the executive to consult with the Voice or follow its advice.

2. The Voice would remedy a "distortion" in our system of governmer The solicitogeneral explained that the Voice would help overcome "barriers that have historically impeded effective participation by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in political discussion and decisions that affect them".
