Grace Fitzpatrick.



Grace Fitzpatrick was our very special Guest Speaker.

Grace arrived in Australia from Ireland in 1970.

She is an Organizational Consultant and consults for the Department of Education.

The area she works in is Workforce Capability in Diversity and Inclusion.

Grace is passionate about equity, respect, diversity, inclusion, collaborating and values are underpinned by her commitment to social justice.

She joined the Prospect Council as a councillor from 2006 to 2010.

It was while she was on Council, she met the soon to be the founding members of PREFER (now PLEG) and with the support of another councillor she championed and encouraged Council to support and provide the start-up funds to establish Prospect's first community garden - Prospect Community Garden.

Prospect Local Environment Group (PLEG) had its humble beginnings in 2006 following a suggestion made from former members of the Prospect Nuclear Free Zone Campaign (1983-1985). They saw the need to establish a new group called Prospect Residents for Forum for Environmental Responsibility Inc (PREFER) to advocate on behalf of residents in the City of Prospect.

A workshop followed with the goal of developing a community environmental action plan.

Approximately 90 local residents and invited experts contributed ideas in round table discussions to list achievable local community environmental actions, focusing around three major themes, local food, local energy, local transport:

- Local food – to ensure we reduce food miles and embodied energy and water in food
- Local transport – to ensure that we travel sustainably and encourage Council to advocate for appropriate transport schemes
- Local energy – develop initiatives with the community and government to encourage energy conservation and local generation.

In 2010 at our AGM, Grace was elected Chairperson and have continued in the role since.
