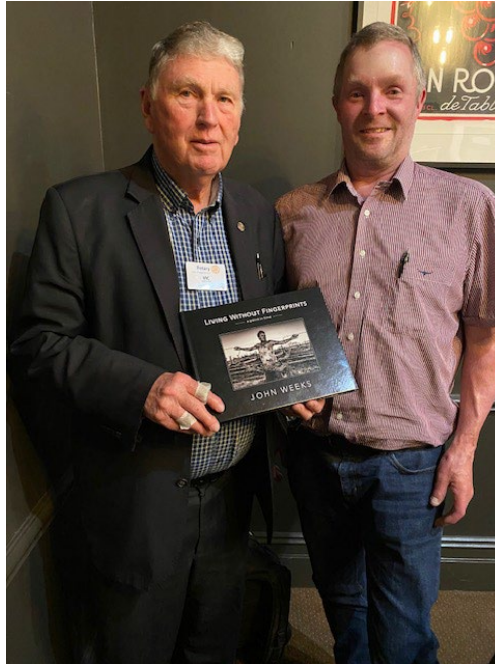
Notes from Meeting #2158 – 22nd of August.
