Barry Blundell – Robbery Under Arm.



Barry is an ex-work colleague of Jack Kelso.

Barry worked for 42 years in the SA Police, 30 years as a Detective and was awarded the Australian Police Medal in 2015 and now a member of the Police Historical Society.

Barry worked in Child Abuse for 10 years.

Barry presented a unique situation at the turn of the last century (1900) where 2 men stole horses from a property near Salisbury.

The arm robbery of a pay roll of gold and silver coins in the Port River area in 1902.

The story starts around 2.00am when the 2 horses were stolen.

The men travelled down Torrens Rd to Ocean Steamers Rd.

10.30am the men dressed as Butchers entered the Colac Hotel in the Port area.

Managers from the nearby Smelters, once a fortnight collect the workers' wages (wages for approx. 400 men) from the Union Bank in Port Adelaide.

On their way back to the Smelters approximately 2.00pm, two men on horseback approached them and as they got near, they put on their mask.

One of the masked men on horseback shot and killed one of the Smelters men horses.

The masked men collected the payroll and rode off.

The masked men travelled to Henley Beach Rd and travelled towards South Rd.

The first arrest was at 11.00am the next morning.

The second was arrested a few days later.

Both men were given 20 years hard labour.

This was a great presentation by Barry, and he held the club members mesmerized.
