Rotary has success

WHYALLA - The Rotary Club of Whyalla was honoured with a Premier's Distinction Award at the Service Clubs Association of SA (SCASA) presentation night on Sunday, March 2.

The Premier's Distinction Award was shared between the Rotary Clubs of Whyalla, Mount Barker, Murray Bridge and Mobilong and is the highest honour SCASA has.

SCASA consists of the Rotary clubs, Kiwanis, Lions clubs, Soroptomists and Zonta clubs throughout South Australia.

The presentation night serves to recognise

the selfless work of these clubs within a range of categories.

The Rotary Club of Whyalla was awarded the Premier's Distinction Award for its overseas playground relocation project.

The project sees the removal and repurposing of old playground equipment which is subsequently sent overseas to communities in need.

Most recently, the club sent some playground equipment to a community in Mongolia.

Rotary Club of Whyalla president Ms Owens said that while Rotarians would say they were not involved in the club for the accolades, she was over the moon at having won the award.

"My club are beside themselves, they are so happy that what we do has been recognised," Ms Owens said.

"We came away from the awards with over \$2000, which is the equivalent of us taking our van out three or four times to earn that kind of money."

The club came away with a string of other awards and recognitions as well, including the Community Education Award, the Community Sustainability Award and two high commendations in the Supporting Communities and Team

Award categories.

Ms Owens said the Rotary Club of Whyalla did not usually enter the awards, but decided to do it this year after witnessing other clubs having success.

"When I was the district governor and the district governor it was one part of my job to attend these things, I just felt so wonderful to see these Rotary clubs win things, proving that what we do is really good," she said.

With only 14 members, the club is indeed small, but Ms Owens said it was encouraging to see the tangible impact it can have on the community.

"Lots of service clubs are finding it hard getting more volunteers, and we're trying to work around that," she said.

"Rotary and other service clubs work damn hard in what they do, and they are always looking for good ways to spend the money that they raise."

Ms Owens said the Rotary club is planning a fundraiser to go towards drought relief and hopes the community will get behind it.

"If we could do something in the community and bring the community together to raise some more money to send to the farmers, it would be wonderful."
